If you are in town for a major event, make sure to plan your in-flight catering in advance since there will be a spike in private aviation traffic.

Boston is an active city with many annual events, outdoor activities, and a rich history. Boston hosts a number of parades and events, including the [Boston Marathon](#) and the [St. Patrick's Day Parade](#). The area has plenty of outdoor activities to keep you busy. The [New England Aquarium](#) and [Museum of Science](#) are fun places to spend an afternoon while in Boston. If you are looking for a unique way to take a piece of Boston with you, the area has two [antique markets](#) filled with antique dealers. [Boston's SoWo district](#) is the perfect place to visit for art enthusiasts, with many art galleries to browse. If you are in the area on a Sunday, explore the SoWa Vintage Market. For a day of shopping and a great selection of dining spots, [Faneuil Hall Marketplace](#) is a favorite destination.

Boston has a bustling culinary scene with many great options to choose from. [Sonsie](#), [L'Espalier](#), and [O Ya](#) are all highly rated local favorites. For breakfast, try [Mike & Patty's](#), [The Paramount](#), or [The Breakfast Club](#). [The Gilded Lady](#), [The Quarterdeck Inn by the Sea](#), and [Clarendon Square Inn](#) are just a few of the many bed and breakfast inns around Boston. For ultimate relaxation, [G2O Spa](#), [Exhale Spa](#), and [Bella Sante](#) are all top picks for a day spa retreat.
